
Hazardous Chemical Waste Labeling and Storage

Labeling

Hazardous chemical waste labels must be complete, legible and placed on the waste container upon the start of accumulation.

Instructions

- 1. Download, complete and print the labels below.
- 2. Cut out and affix the label on to the hazardous chemical waste container.



Storage

- Segregate waste by hazard class to prevent incompatible mixtures. Hazard class examples include: flammable, oxidizer, acid, base, and toxic. For more information on chemical incompatibility, consult a safety data sheet (SDS).
- Keep waste container lids closed, except when adding waste.
- Store waste containers in secondary containment to adequately contain all of the contents of the container.
- Dispose of waste within 6 months of being generated.
 - Hazardous chemical waste that meets the quantity threshold of 55 gallons of hazardous waste or 1 quart of <u>acutely / extremely hazardous waste</u> must be transferred to EH&S for disposal within 3 days of reaching these set volumes.
- Inspect waste containers weekly for signs of leaks, corrosion, or deterioration.
- Do not dispose of hazardous waste using sinks, drains, intentional evaporation, or as regular trash.
